

**La Center High School Seniors Support Youth
CWP Service Hours Requirement 2009-2010**

What is service learning?

The core concept driving this educational strategy is that by combining service objectives and learning objectives, along with the intent to show measurable change in both the recipient and the provider of the service, the result is a radically-effective transformative method of teaching students.

Expectations:

-15 hours of contact time. We prefer you work with La Center middle or elementary students. We want you to work directly with a student or group of students. If you wish to make a proposal to do service in an area not listed below, do it with your C.W.P. teacher's approval, using the form that is included below.

- Summer service hours may be pre-approved by your C.W.P. teacher after you have filled out the pre-approval paperwork that includes developing a plan and rubric. More information about this is at the end of this information sheet.

- You might do any combination of activities to reach 15 hours. Also one activity—ie: coaching a basketball team meets requirements. Follow the required paperwork steps included at the end of this overview.

- Cispus will count towards service hours, if you follow the required paperwork steps included at the end of this overview.

- Running a time clock or making copies for an adult does not fit our criteria. If you are a teacher's aide, you are doing this work for credit so it will not be applicable to C.W.P service hours.

-We have brainstormed a list of activities. After you have selected an activity or activities, we expect your **written service plan by September 30, 2009**. You are not limited to our activity list. However, you must use the approval form and have in before 9/30/09.

- September 30th is an important deadline. Do not wait, begin working on it now.

- All service must be completed by 4/30/10 to participate in senior graduation exercises.

Brainstorming List

- Ms. Firl from La Center Community Education is the person to contact if you have a talent to instruct an intramural class through community education. For example: arts, music instrument instruction, auto repair, web page design, application of various software classes, internet safety class, photography, creative writing, yoga, motorcycle maintenance, wood or metal projects, clay or pottery exploration, drama techniques, cosmic activity?any class may be taught as long as Ms. Firl approves the activity.

Follow the steps below to complete service requirements.

Target

Apply your skills, knowledge and talents to improve the lives of middle and elementary school students. If you prefer, you may propose an alternative service option.

Either way, service is completed by April 30th 2010.

Steps 1 and 2 are due on 9/30/09

Step 1. Create your written **community service plan including: measurable, realistic goals.**

Plan a timeline from beginning to end, write out the sequence of actions you will be doing throughout your service; identify the dates and times you will be engaged in activities; determine the best person to sign off on your contributions.

Step 2. Create a rubric for evaluating your plan. The rubric needs to include your evaluation of **growth in relation to your goals**. Be sure to address the quality of your planning and execution of your plan. Assess your work ethic and level of enthusiasm. Get feedback from others who were involved with your service plan, including the kids you supported. Include the feedback in your reflection writing. Steps one and two are due by 9/30/09.

Step 3. Execute your plan. Keep a journal and write a few sentences after each meeting with the people you are serving. This will help you write a final reflection for your portfolio. Yes, you will turn this in too.

Step 4. Evaluate your effectiveness including input from: student(s), teacher(s), parent(s).... (if applicable) Remember you have already constructed a rubric. Now is the time to use it.

Step 5. *Write your reflection including how you reached the target. (see below) Your journal should help you write a terrific paper. Both the journal and reflection paper will be turned in together.

Step 6. All of this work is due by 4/30/10 and should be kept in your Navigation portfolio after completion.
