Career Day: La Center Middle School hosted a Career Day on February 3! This day gives students a chance to learn about 4 different careers. Our goal for the Career Fair is for students to broaden their perspectives about future options. When students think about future careers, they are more likely to be motivated in school and set goals for their futures. Our keynote speaker was Dr. Jeromy Dixon from Smiles Dental, and other presenters included state patrolmen, parks and recreation, engineer/entrepreneur, travel, FBI, nurse, baker, fashion design, interior design, health coach, massage therapist, CEO, deputy coroner and homeland security. Family Watershed Festival: On February 12th our middle school hosted this fun family evening where participants were able to test water, look at little stream bugs, touch animal pelts and skulls, and learn more about how to keep our streams and wetlands healthy. There also was a special presentation on the upcoming three year project for restoring the La Center Bottoms. This evening was sponsored by the Washington Dept. of Ecology, the city of Vancouver Water Resource Education Center, the Lower Columbia Estuary Partnership, Clark County Environmental Services, and Sound Native Plants.

Interim Smarter Balanced Assessments: We are beginning to pilot the interim tests with selected small groups of students, to better know about what to expect for this spring's summative state assessments. Both math and ELA (English/Language Arts) assessments are online, and we are learning from the sample group of students with hopes to best be prepared for this new form of state testing in May. Later, the interim assessments will be given to classes of students to expose all of our students to the new format and expectations.
