Bobcat Behavior Fair

We are currently in the midst of our second Bobcat Behavior Fair this school year. The first took place in September. As part of our school-wide behavior support plan, each class participates in two Bobcat Behavior Fairs where they rotate through five sessions to discuss behavior expectations in the campus areas of recess/playshed, bathrooms, waiting/entering area near the office, hallways/resolution room, and the cafeteria. Students learn and discuss how we are expected to be respectful to ourselves, others, and things in each area. The fairs have gone very well. Our learning community efforts with our school-wide behavior support plan, including our Bobcat Behavior Fairs, seem to be having a positive impact. Our data has shown a significant decline in discipline referrals for the 2014-2015 school year. Thank you for your support.
