Superintendent's Board Report August, 2016

Construction-

The various projects continue to cruise along. The most important being the installation of the four portable classrooms on the K-8 campus. Installation is complete, skirting on, ramps in place, electric and water connected. We are now waiting on the interior finish which will take place next week. Final concern is the installation of the fire sprinkler system. They assure us they'll have it done in time for teachers to occupy by Tuesday before school! Way too close for me and it makes me very nervous. That said, they continue to assure it will get done.

We have new playground chips in place and new bark has been spread at the K-8 this last week now we're just cleaning up and detailing. I think it will look very nice for the opening of school.

Baseball field will be seeded on Monday and Tuesday the 22nd and 23rd. Irrigation is almost complete and drainage will be finished obviously before seeding.

The garden and the stadium project are both moving along slowly but surely with the contractor stretched a little thin. I communicated earlier that the roof will not be installed for this football season but the field and stands will be preserved for use. The roof installation will begin the first week of November. The garden will be ready for spring planting.

School bond-

Laurie and I have met with a variety of ESD representatives concerning our possible pursuit of a bond this upcoming year. We've learned a lot and have a laundry list of items to complete and check off in order to put the district in a position to ask the board for a resolution on this issue.
