
LCHS Board Report February 18, 2016

The end of the 1st semester data is being gathered and analyzed by the administration team and members of the School Improvement Team. To begin, we have 136 students that have improved their GPA by .25 from the second semester of 2015 to the 1st semester of 2016. Congratulations to those students for the hard work they have put into their learning. Mrs. Luiz is still collecting the data from the Running Start students to see how many total students from LCHS are on the honor roll this semester, which is a 3.5 semester GPA.

As we look at the LSI for the freshman, 118/151 or 78% have earned 3 credits this first semester. Some 9th graders have more high school credits because of taking algebra in the middle school and/or Jazz Band zero period. There is 33/151 or 22% of our freshman that are behind in credit. These students are currently meeting with teachers and counselors to put a plan in place to help them regain those missing credits.

The data pertaining to the 9th grade Focus class is showing that the additional support is helping students transition into high school. Also Mrs. Gozart's 9th grade English class, which was created by our English department for incoming students that struggled in English during their 8th grade year, is showing that 83% are passing and meeting standards. These two classes created as an intervention for struggling 9th graders is showing positive outcomes.

The Green Team is moving forward on the development of the La Center Garden Project. Thank you to the students from the Environmental Studies class for their work on creating additional dioramas and Powerpoint showing the details of each component of the garden. Also, thank you to Josh Soske for his contribution in working with the city to obtain permits and creating the map below that shows the dimensions of the garden. We are moving forward with the project and hope to break ground this spring. Also, the Green Team is including more interested community groups who have shown an interest in supporting the school with the development of the garden.
