Kids Making Miracles for Doernbechers Pajama Jam - 30 middle school students, 4 high school students and 22 elementary students went to OHSU to learn more about how they have impacted children through their service. We blocked out our mornings to dedicate focused testing time and ran regular classes in the afternoons. Having multiple Chromebooks available has eased the pressure for students and staff of how we schedule these tests. Our Wi-Fi has been overall fabulous, again with only a couple of hold-ups.

Records are made to be broken – This year at the Sub-District track meet we had two school records broken: 8<sup>th</sup> grade students Natasha Lewis broke the record for the 1600 meter race, and Hunter Haugen broke the school record for the Shot Put. Congratulations to both athletes.

I think between the multiple cakes, donuts, cookies, coffees and candy bars we may have added some inches to the waistline... We serve such amazing students and families who contribute to the mutual respect and care that we share in our culture.
