

La Center School District Library Annual Report 2016-2017

K-8 Library

Elementary Library:

The total number of classes using the library was 25 classes in grades K-4. Each grade receives a 30-minute time of library instruction and checkout. During the 2016-2017 school year, 841 patrons checked out 26,729 titles.

October Scholastic Book Fair sales were \$6725.36 and profit was \$3708.94. Each teacher received up to \$50.00 in free books of their choice.

February 23rd - assisted 5th grade classes with access to the World Book Database and helped with research on current projects

March 2nd - Celebrated Read Across America Day by matching elementary classes with middle school language arts classes to read together.

March Scholastic Book Fair sales were \$6201.91 and profit was \$4031.24. Each teacher received up to \$50.00 in free books of their choice.

April 15th - Grades K-3 participated in the Washington Children's Choice Picture Book Award by casting final vote; 123,621 students in the state of WA voted.

June - Collaborated with FVRL La Center branch to kick off the Summer Reading Program

Middle School Library:

Middle School and 5th grade students receive individualized instruction based on needs. During the 2016-2017 school year, 587 patrons checked out 5,570 titles.

Weeded: 570 Added: 475

The middle school side of the library was relocated to the entrance of the library. Bistro style tables and chairs were added along with low level molded seating.

October Scholastic Book Fair sales were \$3289.84 and profit was \$1809.41. Each teacher received up to \$50.00 in free books of their choice.

February 9-10th - Collaborated with 7th and 8th grade history classes to help with research, use of databases, search skills and identifying fake news.

February 23rd - Helped Mrs. Brothers' classes with developing bibliographies in Google Docs.
