

# La Center School District Library Annual Report 2017-2018

## Elementary Library:

The total number of classes using the library was 31 classes in grades K-5. Each grade receives a 30-minute time of library instruction and checkout. During the 2017-2018 school year, 877 patrons checked out 27,802 titles.
