

## La Center School District Library Annual Report 2018-2019

### Elementary Library:

The total number of elementary classes K-5 using the library was 32. Each grade received 30-minutes of library instruction and checkout. During the 2018-2019 school year 831 patrons checked out 31,409 titles.
