

La Center School District Library Annual Report 2020-2021

Elementary Library:

The total number of classes using the library was 31 classes in grades K-5. Each grade received a 30-minute time of library instruction and checkout. During the 2020-2021 school year, 678 patrons checked out 11,886 titles.

Sept. 15th -Online lessons began at each grade level once a week.

Oct. 26th -Zoom meetings with entire grade levels began weekly to promote library lessons.

Oct. 26th -Curbside library service began and continued through the school year. Seventy-one pickups occurred in grades K-5.

Nov. 2nd -Kindergarten A/B hybrid started in-person. Library lessons/checkout began in classrooms.

Jan. 19th -First and second grade A/B hybrid started in-person. Library lessons/checkout began in classrooms.

Third through fifth were gradually brought back on an A/B hybrid schedule in-person and library checkout began in classrooms.

March 15th - 28th -Scholastic Virtual Book Fair. Book fair sales were \$4,578.96 and the profit was \$1,144.73 to purchase new library books.

April 19th -Library classes began in the library. All students were back at school full time and MaryLynn Henderson came back.

May- Grades K-3 participated in the Washington Children's Choice Picture Book Award by casting a final vote. A total of 53,314 students in the state of Washington voted.

Middle School Library:

Middle School students received individualized instruction based on needs. During the 2020-2021 school year, 409 patrons checked out 2,831 titles.

Sept. -Celebration of Banned Book Week was held by online presentations to the 8th grade about banned/challenged books.

Oct. 26th -Curbside library service began and continued through the school year. Ninety-seven pickups occurred in grades 6-8.

Dec. 10th -Digital citizenship lessons with Stephanie Holmes and Daniel Thiessen began for entire grade levels through Zoom.

Jan. 4th -Maria Rolph came to assist with middle and elementary library.

Feb. 22nd -Students return to A/B hybrid in-person. Curbside library service switches to classroom delivery to middle school students.

Feb. 25th - March 12th -Middle school presentations were held to promote the Connect Cards from FVRL (Fort Vancouver Regional Library).

March 15th - 28th -Scholastic Virtual Book Fair was held in collaboration with the elementary school.

April 19th -The library became open to all middle school students. Grades 3-12 were back to full-time in-person instruction.

May 10th -Moving preparations for the new middle school began. Books began getting boxed up and organized. Some books were transferred to the elementary. Older books were weeded and given to teachers. New book orders were placed for the new school library.

High School Library:

High school students received individualized instruction based on needs. During the 2020-2021 school year, 487 patrons checked out 1,032 titles.

Coral Yee, High School Library Technician, provided assistance to students by appointment. Additional technology duties included handling the Family Tech Support calls and assisting teachers with their technology needs. Tier 3 students received additional support with their online lessons who could not access the internet café.
